The International Piano Competition for Young Pianists Kronberg, for pianists between the ages of 6 and 19, has a clear goal: to foster and promote their musical talent, tailored to each age group. To this end, the initiators have created a globally unique set of conditions.

- It is one of the few international competitions with seven age groups, which each include two birth year cohorts. So pianists between the ages of 6 and 12 can also compete with other pianists their own age thus helping to promote young talent in particular.
- Valuable special prizes await the participants from masterclasses with renowned teachers to individually tailored early development programs.
- In addition, the extraordinarily generous monetary prizes can motivate participants to give their best.

ON STAGE WITH A SELF-CHOSEN PROGRAM

Teachers and students decide together what will be played – the formula for success in order to win.

Pianists who want to showcase their personal strengths also want to choose their own repertoire. An opportunity which is rarely granted – at the International Piano Competition for Young Pianists Kronberg, participants are given precisely this chance.

- The young Musicians are free to choose what they play. Depending on the age group, at least two complete works, movements or pieces from two to three epochs are mandatory. This program gives young pianists a lot of leeway, thus promoting their development.
- In a digital preliminary round, participants qualify by submitting a video of their audition.
- The competition will be held in the Casals Forum Kronberg which opened in 2022 and meets the highest acoustic and musical standards.



The Casals Forum attracted a lot of attention when it opened and is now considered one of the best chamber music halls in the world. Above all, it has been praised for its first-class acoustics and achitecture.

has been Artistic Director of the Tidal Concerts in East Frisia since 2012. As a professor at Rostock University of Music and Theatre, he shares his experience and artistic ideals with his students.

The hotel near the Casals Forum will offer participants rooms at reduced prices – thus making it an attractive option to stay, even after the competition is over.



There are new competitions springing up all the time – but the International Piano Competition for Young Pianists Kronberg is ushering in a new era for the music community. Ulrike Danne-Feldmann explained in several interviews what makes this competition so unique.





nmz: Kronberg has made a name for itself mainly through the renowned Kronberg Academy, which is geared toward string players. The newly finished Casals Forum in particular, which will be the Academy's concert venue and where you are also holding your competition, highlights how important this institution is. Does your competition benefit from Kronberg's reputation or are you just standing in the shadow of an established organization?

Ulrike Danne-Feldmann: Of course Kronberg is a city in which, due to the enormous achievements of the Kronberg Academy, music has a special place. However, we are completely independent of the Kronberg Academy and are moving on an entirely different plane, both instrumentally and musically, with our competition's focus on solo piano. The only point of contact is the use of the Casals Forum for which we are of course paying a user fee. We are very grateful and happy to be able to offer our young pianists this extraordinary concert hall which is impressing global audiences with its outstanding acoustics, facilities and ambience.

nmz: If there is one thing that is not underrepresented in Germany's cultural landscape, it is music competitions. How does this competition differ from the "sea" of other competitions, or how do you think it does?

Ulrike Danne-Feldmann: There is not a single piano competition for young pianists in Germany that awards prizes of up to 20,000 Euros in seven age groups, that provides special prizes with a focus on musical development (masterclasses, etc.) and that offers participants a competition venue like the Casals Forum. The seven age groups, which each include two birth year cohorts, also promote young pianists from ages 6 to 12 and thus the beginnings of pianistic training, because the age difference in a category is small – unlike in many other youth competitions. With Professors Kirschnereit, Pohl, and Schellenberger we were also able to assemble a jury which, in addition to its high professional quality, appreciates and respects the young musicians. In addition to the spirit of competition, we think it is vital that the participants are given the opportunity to form a community among themselves, have personal encounters, and learn from each other. We want to do everything possible to create a personal atmosphere in which the young pianists feel totally at ease, and so we are offering them, among other things, a supplemental program which will be free of charge. ...
